

**How to Log In**

- **On Campus:** direct access from library's Resources page.
- **Off Campus:** Enter your campus network username in the first text box. In the second enter your network password.\*

\*NOTE: you must have a campus network account for this to work.

**About the Database**

American Psychological Association's (APA) renowned resource for abstracts of scholarly journal articles, book chapters, books, and dissertations is the largest resource devoted to **peer-reviewed literature in behavioral science and mental health**. It contains over 2.5 million citations and summaries dating as far back as the early 1800s. Journal coverage spans from 1887 to present, and includes international material selected from more than 2,200 periodicals in more than 27 languages. (description from <http://www.ebscohost.com>)

**After logging in OFF CAMPUS—Select PsycINFO** from the database collection list, and click the **Continue** button to begin.

**ADVANCED SEARCH**

**Step 1)** Enter your search term(s) in the text boxes. **Use a separate box for each term or phrase—terms entered in a single box will be treated as a phrase.**

Apply **Limits**—below the search interface—to narrow your search by audience or document type, peer reviewed, etc.

- Click the **Search** button after you have entered your search term(s) and selected limits.

**Step 2)** When results display, **Narrow** your search—use the options to the left to further focus your search using the subject headings (assigned to each article).

**Step 3)** The presence of icons below a citation indicates the full text is available for viewing, printing, etc.:



Use **References Available** to locate articles which contain a bibliography or list of works cited.

**Print, Email, Save, Cite, etc.**

When viewing an article citation, you may choose to print or email the article, citation or abstract immediately, create a citation for your bibliography, export to a third-party citation product, or save the item to your folder for later use.

Click **Help** to view a topical list of assistance pages with screen shots and step by step directions. A link to **Help** will always appear in the upper right corner of your screen.



**My EBSCO**

Create your own EBSCO account within any EBSCO collection, and store located information (citations, searches, journal alerts) from one search session to another.

Your MyEBSCO account allows you to store located articles, images, videos, searches results, etc. for all EBSCO collections. You can also set up search alerts and journal alerts, both of which utilize an email notification feature. For more information, contact a librarian.
