DWU went on to the National AAU Tournament to win the first two games before losing the third game to Schuessler Athletic Club of Chicago 39-35 in overtime.

Longest Single Season Streak

24 games in a row (1978-79)

The Tigers lost their first and fourth games before winning 24 straight. They lost their first game in the NAIA National Tournament to Central Washington, ending the season with a 26-3 record.

19 games in a row (1942-43)

The only losses that year were to Augustana during the regular season and Cape Girardeau College of Missouri in the NAIA National Tournament. Cape Girardeau went on to win the national championship.

In 1945, DWU was invited to participate in the tournament, but the coach declined because many basketball players were serving in the armed services by tournament time.

- Three national tournament teams reached the quarterfinals: 1931-32 (AAU), 1938-39 and 1945-46 (NAIA).
- In 1937 and 1941, DWU finished second in the conference but was invited to the tournament.
- In 1938, DWU finished fourth in the conference but won the first playoff in the conference to qualify for the national tournament.
- The first NAIA National Tournament was in 1937. Dakota Wesleyan played the first game of that tournament, losing to Southwestern Kansas 54-26.
- In 1939, DWU beat Texas West Teachers College, who were billed, "The Tallest Team in the World."
- Only Northern has appeared in more NAIA national tournaments (15) than DWU (14) for South Dakota colleges.
- No South Dakota college has appeared in more consecutive NAIA national tournaments than Dakota Wesleyan (five from 1937-41).
- DWU qualified for the NAIA National Tournament in 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09. It is the school's longest streak since Wesleyan had five consecutive national tournament bids that ran from the 1936-37 season through the 1940-41 season.

Other Highlights

- The DWU men's basketball team defeated two No. 1-ranked teams in consecutive seasons. The 2006-07 DWU men's basketball team beat No. 1-ranked University of Sioux Falls 72-60 at home on Jan. 27, 2007. In the following season, the Tigers did it again, defeating No. 1-ranked Morningside College 91-79 at the Corn Palace.
- Dakota Wesleyan set a conference record with three consecutive GPAC Men's Basketball Players-of-the-Week in January 2009. Brady Wiebe earned the honor on Jan. 12, Mitch Bain followed on Jan. 19 and Ike Muoneke was the Jan. 26 recipient.
- DWU reached its first-ever GPAC Men's Basketball Postseason Championship Game in 2008-09.
- Dakota Wesleyan enjoyed its most successful three-year stretch from 2006-09. In those three seasons, the Tigers won at least 24 games in each campaign and finished 73-26 (.737) overall.
