Summary of Results from Implementing Direct Measures of Student Learning:

- 1. Based on the criteria, the average score for the exam was a 91%. Criterion was met.
- 2. Based on the criteria the average score was a 3.4 out of 4 for the 10 portfolios submitted. Criterion was met

Summary of Results from Implementing Indirect Measures of Student Learning:

- 1. Of the 8 students who participated in the survey 100% were in agreement that the program prepared them and the average score of 4.5 out 5. The criteria was met.
- 2. Based on the criteria set, students scored a 3.8 out of 4.0 scale. The criterion was met
