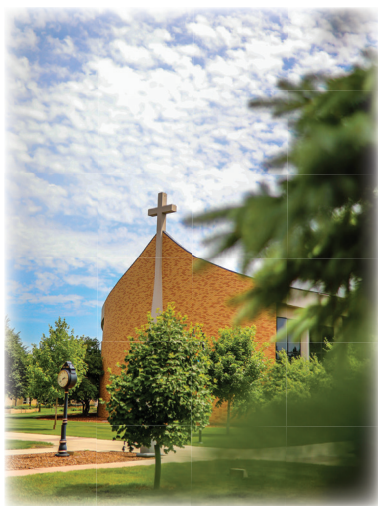

Annual Graduate Survey Data

- 93% of graduates would recommend DWU to a student seeking a quality educational experience.
